

# To prioritize GRU targets through Google Scholar

Google Scholar search results now display the “Find It @ GRU” link to allow you to locate full-text articles and journals at GRU. The link will automatically display to the right of Google references when searches originate on campus and the resource is available at GRU. Some customization is required to prioritize GRU resources in your search results from off-campus, however.

- Begin at [www.google.com](http://www.google.com)
- Select the “apps” icon in the top right (resembles a square comprised of 9 smaller squares)
- Select “More”
- Select “Even more from Google”
- Select the “Scholar” search option under the category “Specialized Search”

- Conduct a Google search for “Google Scholar”

From the Google Scholar main page, select “Settings” from the top right.


