Pregnant Radiation Workers

POLICY STATEMENT

Radiation exposure to the developing fetus of occupational radiation workers shall be maintained as low as is reasonably achievable, and within federal and state regulatory limits as found in the Nuclear Regulatory Commission Title 10 CFR 20.1208. Reducing radiation exposures of employees who have voluntarily declared that they are pregnant may include modification of duties or reassignment, as appropriate, during the pregnancy to minimize or avoid occupational radiation exposure.
