## Laptop Policy and Requirements for All Programs

The CAHS programs have instructional and communication objectives and strategies that determine student laptop computer requirements. The ability to access internet - based resources during classroom educational activities is an invaluable resource for meeting objectives and achieving curriculum outcomes.

The CAHS recognizes that basic and advanced health education, continuing education, and lifelong learning requires students to embrace and effectively use computer technology. Examples of how student laptop computers are used include presenting educational content, encouraging student collaboration, and assessing student understandings and progress.

Specific Uses May Include:

- Online Testing
- Patient Simulation
- Small Group Problem Based Learning
- Online Course Delivery System
- Viewing Captured Lecture and Electronic Reference Resources
- Program Certification Preparation
- Integrated Learning System

Expected Competencies Include:

- Use software and hardware for word processing, presentation design, and electronic journal retrieval. Access and use web browsers, internet search engines, varied web plug-ins (Adobe Acrobat, Real Player, Shockwave), web-based library resources, and on- line databases.
- Access to the internet for web enhanced and web based courses.
- Send and receive e-mail, send and receive electronic documents, open and attach documents to e-mail.
- Participate in on-line course delivery via the learning management system (LMS).
- Participate in on-line web conferencing.
- Take assessment using an online testing system.
- Update virus protection and operating system updates each week.
- Ability to print required documents.

### Minimum Requirements

The requirement assures that all student computers meet certain minimum technical requirements. This consistency simplifies troubleshooting and support and assures a level playing field for all students in the program. Upon matriculation, all Allied Health Sciences students must have a laptop computer system, PC or MAC and accessories that meet the following current Augusta University requirements. Note: if a student has repeated problems on a computer that does not meet minimum specifications, CAHS will request that the student purchase a computer that is in line with these requirements. The computer specifications listed below are a minimum requirement for participation in the Augusta University College of Allied Health Sciences. Some programs within the college may have additional specifications. Please refer to your specific program for additional recommendations.

## Student Responsibilities

Students are responsible for maintaining their personal laptop computer software and hardware. Hardware or software failure will not excuse students from course responsibilities. Students are responsible for all software installs and updates required for course management and network connectivity.

An IT Checklist will be provided to all students. Students are responsible for completing the checklist before arriving on campus. Students can receive troubleshooting from the walk-up help desk for the following:

- Download and installation of ExamSoft software
- Configuration of secure wireless
- Download and install [Office 365 for Students](#)

Individual coursework may require additional specialized software. In this case, faculty members will ensure the software requirements are clearly delineated in the course syllabus. Students are then responsible for acquiring the specialized software necessary to complete specific course requirements.
