- The most competitive applicants will have completed all core curriculum requirements in Areas A, D and F at the time of application
- Elective courses in Areas A, D and F should be math or science courses
- The application essay should be unique, specific and relevant to the Radiation Therapy Program
- Applicants with more than six (6) unmet core curriculum requirements will not qualify for a personal interview
