How to Submit a Specimens to the Oral Pathology Laboratory at Augusta University Dental College of Georgia

<u>Contributors outside AU DCG</u>: To sign up for our biopsy service, or to obtain more kits for incisional/excisional biopsies, please contact Ms. Regina Hand at 706-721-8491. We contract with PATH-TEC to ship kits to our contributors, and to ship specimens from contributors to our laboratory, at no cost to contributors.

- 1) Prepare necessary materials
 - a. For cytologic preparations (smears) (in-house kits are located in the Oral Medicine Clinic)
 - i. Microscope glass slide x 2 in a slide holder
 - ii. Cytofix spray **or** hairspray
 - iii. Cement-mixing spatula for sample collection
 - iv. Diagnostic Pathology Request form
 - v. Biopsy Submission Consent and Payment Authorization Form
 - vi. Medical insurance information copy front and back of medical insurance card
 - b. For incisional or excisional biopsy*
 - i. Container with label and 10% phosphate-buffered formalin
 - ii. Diagnostic Pathology Request form
 - iii. Biopsy Submission Consent and Payment Authorization Form
 - iv. Medical insurance information copy front and back of medical insurance card
- 2) Obtain consent (Biopsy Submission Consent and Payment Authorization Form)
- 3) Fill out the forms completely!
- 4) Label formalin container/slide holder (at minimum, patient's name and date of procedure)
- 5) Obtain samples
- 6) Place container with specimen (or slide holder with smears fixed to slides) inside Biohazard-labeled plastic bag with paper towel
- 7) Place filled out forms in an outside pouch of the same Biohazard-labeled plastic bag
- 8) <u>In-house</u> (AU DCG): Bring all materials to Oral Pathology Laboratory GC2164 and leave on front bench for processing. <u>Outside contributors</u>: prepare UPS package and call PATH-TEC for pick-up.

Note: Standard processing and evaluation of soft tissue specimens is completed and reported by FAX within 1-2 business days of specimen arrival. Hard tissue may require additional time to process. Should further testing be needed, the contributor will be notified.
