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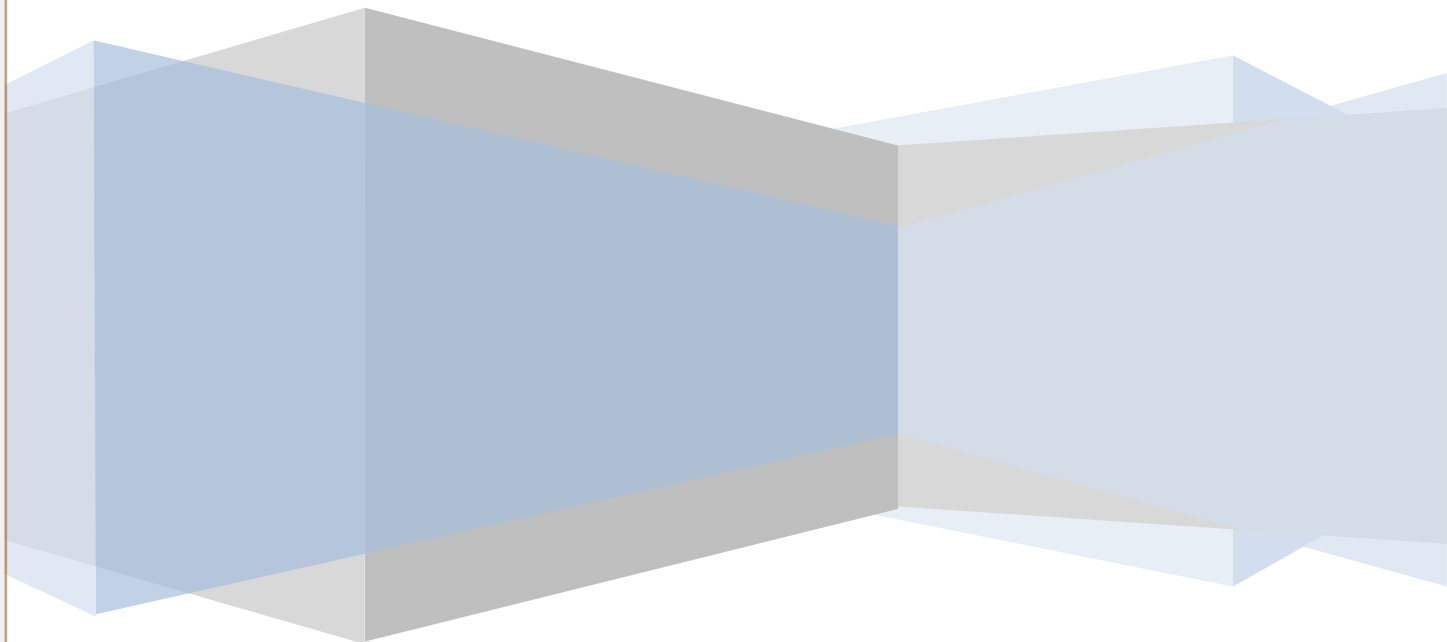

2.1 Application Requirements


Mosby Skills is delivered via the internet. It is recommended that the user(s) utilize one of the supported browsers and operating systems.

What is New in this Release

2.2.0 Patient Education

This feature of Mosby Skills provides learner(s) and administrator(s) the ability to search, view, and print patient education handouts. The functionality is accessed via the **Patient Education** tab located adjacent to the **Skills** tab on the Mosby Skills toolbar.

 **Note:**

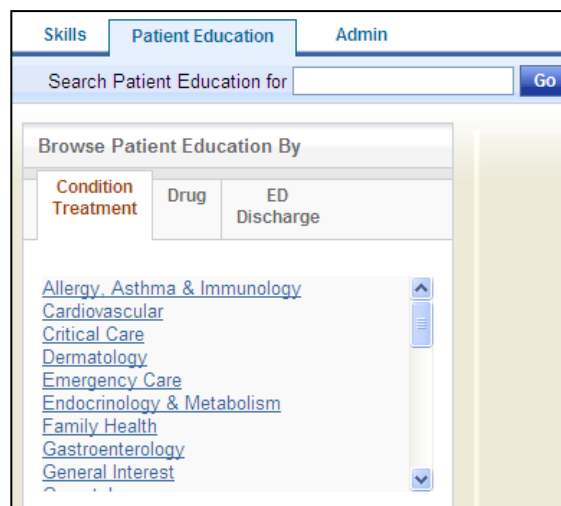
- If the user(s) desires to click between both Mosby **Skills** tab and the **Patient Education** tab to use the functionality, the design feature does not allow the user(s) to recall the previous page location from the **Skills** tab. The user(s) will be taken to the Skills homepage at that point.
- The user(s) has an option to use the browser back button to return to the previous page location.

2.2.1 Patient Education Search

There are two search engines available to locate specific Patient Education handouts. These search engines assist in finding patient education handouts quickly.

User(s) have the opportunity to use one of the following search criteria:

- Search Patient Education for...
- Browse Patient Education by...
 - a. Condition Treatment
 - b. Drug
 - c. ED Discharge



What is New in this Release

2.2.2.0 Patient Education Favorites

A new feature that allows the user to save patient education handouts as favorites. Once saved the user can quickly visit the saved patient education handouts at a later time.

To add patient education handouts to the list of favorites, the user(s) can access the specific handout and click the "Add to Favorite Patient Education" button within the patient education handout. The user can view and delete saved handouts via the **PATIENT EDUCATION HOME** screen or clicking the **Favorites** link in the **PATIENT EDUCATION TOOLS** menu.

2.2.2.1 Save Patient Education Favorites

Using the Add to Favorite Patient Education feature, the user(s) can save a specific patient education handout by doing the following:

1. Navigate to the patient education handouts via using Search Patient Education for... or Browse Patient Education By... search options.
2. Click the patient education handout title link.
3. Click the **[Add to Favorite Patient Education]** button, located in the right corner of the **PATIENT EDUCATION** screen.

It leaves the heart, rises (ascends), arches, and goes down (descends) through the chest until it reaches the diaphragm. The diaphragm is the muscular part between the chest and belly (abdomen). The second part of the aorta is called the abdominal aorta after it has passed the diaphragm and continues down through the abdomen. The abdominal aorta ends where it splits to form the two iliac arteries that go to the legs. Aortic aneurysms can develop anywhere along the length of the aorta. The majority are located along the abdominal aorta. The major concern with an aortic aneurysm is that it can enlarge and rupture. This can cause death unless diagnosed and treated promptly. Half of all persons with untreated abdominal aortic aneurysms die of rupture within 5 years. Aneurysms can also develop blood clots or infections.'

What is New in this Release

2.2.2.2 View Patient Education Favorites

User(s) can view the list of saved patient education handouts, by doing one of the following:

1. Accessing the **PATIENT EDUCATION HOME** screen the grid displays a list of saved patient education handouts.
2. Click the **Favorites** link in the **PATIENT EDUCATION TOOLS** menu the grid displays the saved handouts.

2.2.2.3 Delete Patient Education Favorites

1. User(s) can remove the saved patient education handouts by doing the following:
 - Remove patient handouts one at a time by clicking the box adjacent to the handout to be deleted
 - Remove all by clicking the Select All box.
2. Click the **[Delete]** button.

2.2.3 Patient Education Recent Searches

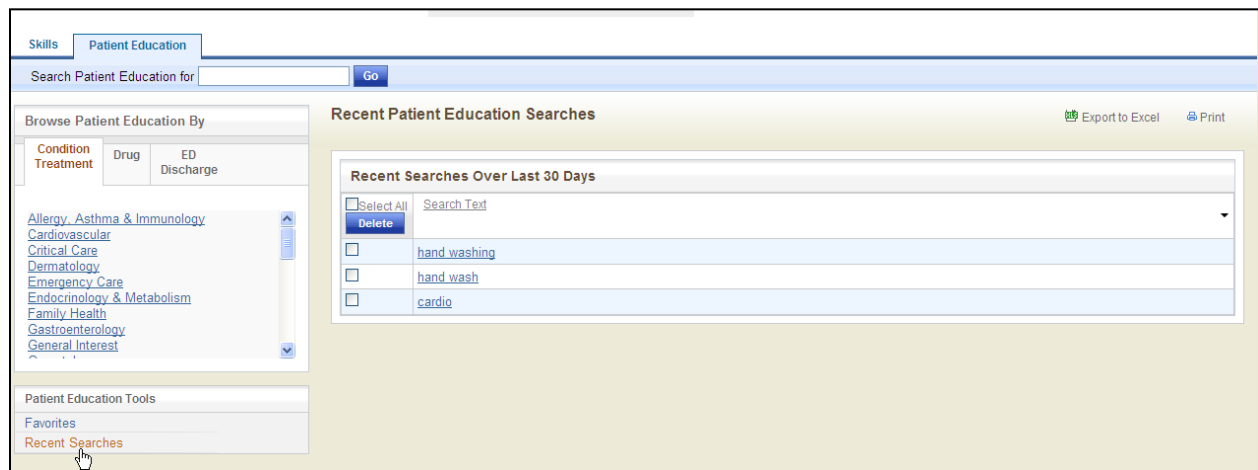
This new feature automatically saves the most recent keyword searches for quick access later. The keyword search results displayed in the Recent Searches Over Last 30 Days grid are saved for 30 days.

The user accesses the [Recent Searches](#) link via the [PATIENT EDUCATION TOOLS](#) menu. Using this function, the user can view and remove recent patient education keyword searches.

2.2.3.1 View Patient Education Recent Searches

User(s) can view the list of recent searches, by doing the following:


1. Click the [Recent Searches](#) link in the [PATIENT EDUCATION TOOLS](#) menu.
2. The following occurs:
 - The **RECENT PATIENT EDUCATION SEARCHES** screen displays
 - The Recent Search Over Last 30 Days grid displays a list of recent search terms






2.2.3.2 Delete Patient Education Recent Searches

1. The user(s) can delete searched term(s) by doing the following:
 - Remove search terms one at a time by clicking the box adjacent to the term to be deleted
 - Remove all by clicking the Select All box
2. Click the **[Delete]** button.

 **Note:** User(s) has the option to sort and toggle the recent searches display between ascending and descending order, by doing one of the following :

- Click the **Search Text** link.
- Click the  arrow.

2.2.4 Skill Content Player Icon Order Change

The **SKILL CONTENT PLAYER** screen displays icons that allow the user(s) accessibility to specific skill information. Incorporated in the new features of Mosby Skills is the re-ordering of the icons. The new order provides an efficient access to modify a skill. The user(s) accesses the **SKILL CONTENT PLAYER** screen by doing the following:

1. Access Mosby Skills Home Page.
2. Navigate to a skill via using Search Skills for..., or Browse Skills By..., search options.
3. The **SKILLS SEARCH** screen displays.
4. Click the skill link.
5. The **SKILL CONTENT PLAYER** screen displays.
