Important Points to Remember:

- All surfaces must be free of gross debris before low-level disinfection occurs.
- (1) wipe should be used to thoroughly saturate area (or three square feet) with proper contact/wet time when performing low-level disinfection.
- DO NOT flush the wipes—dispose of them in an appropriate receptacle.

Disinfecting Wipes Contact and Wet Times

RATIONALE: To ensure proper infection prevention and disinfection when cleaning equipment/surfaces.







PDI Prime Wipe

Contact/Wet Time: 1 minutes

<u>Contains alcohol</u>. Used to low-level disinfect hard, non- porous surfaces of equipment.

PDI AF3 Wipe

Contact/Wet Time: 3 Minutes

<u>Alcohol free</u>. Used to low- level disinfect hard, non-porous surfaces of equipment and is safe for use on electronic devices.

PDI Bleach Wipe

Contact/Wet Time: 4 Minutes

<u>Contains bleach</u>. Used to low-level disinfect hard, non-porous surfaces while caring for patients on enteric contact precautions (i.e. C.diff or norovirus).

To be effective, product surface must <u>remain wet</u> for designated amount of time as set forth by the manufacturer (found on the front of the container).

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
