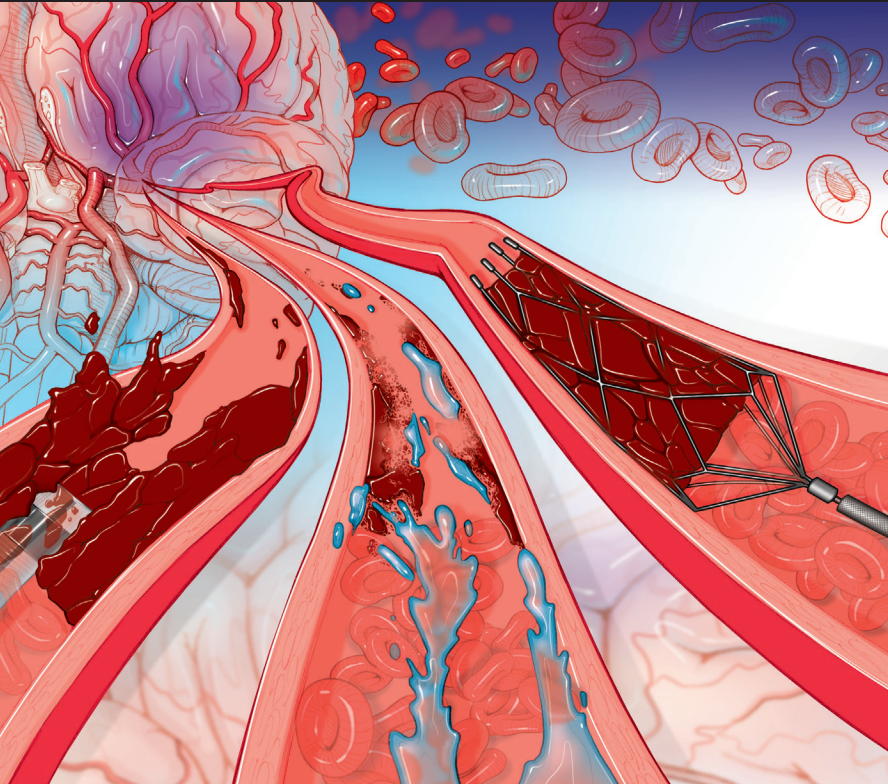

Comprehensive Stroke Update 2022

Purpose: To present updates for stroke prevention, acute stroke interventions, and management of acute stroke complications.
