Approval of Previous Minutes – Dr. Moore called for a vote on the December GMEC minutes. A motion to accept the minutes as written was seconded and approved.

I. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Residency Core Curriculum Schedule** (page 12) – Dr. Moore said that the Residency Core Curriculum Schedule has been set for the remainder of the year but Dr. William Kanto was added in for issues related to the clinical enterprise.

ACTION: The GMEC has completed the IRCC scheduled. **CLOSED ISSUE**

- B. Update of GMEC Subcommittee activities** – Continues to be active, but is behind on one area: Clinical Cardiac Electric Physiology so he will need a program director to do along with him since that is a part of the DOM and we are solely responsible as an institution for being cited for me doing program evaluations with the Internal Review Committee. It is in the written requirements that you are not part of the program being reviewed. Yet the actual writing states you are not a part of the program being reviewed. Will need to bring in a program director to help with this internal review.

ACTION: The GMEC supports the effort to assist in preparing for the Clinical Cardiac Electric Physiology upcoming Internal Review.

- C. Internal Residency Review Committee Activity Update** – Question was presented by a committee member: Upon the Next Accreditation System, are Internal Reviews still going to be conducted? Dr. Moore said that under the NAS,

which will be launched officially in 2014, we have been advised by the Institutional Review Committee that we should actually continue doing internal reviews under the current schedule until we are told differently. Yet, when letters do come the date/recommendation is being left off but they seem to be leaving the schedules up to us to complete. Anticipating for 2013, we will continue as we have done: Document review, the residents interviewed, faculty interviewed and then write up a report.

ACTION: The GMEC encourages all programs taking part in Internal Reviews.
OPEN ISSUE

D. Accreditation Cycles for GME Programs – Dr. Moore spoke of the handout included in today’s agenda (Page 17). He stated that it is an updated Accreditation Date List, featuring the most recent accreditation terms given by the ACGME. Dr. Moore pointed out that the average accreditation length, found at the bottom right of the list, has grown to 4.64 years because of the extended accreditation lengths given to the programs that are part of the Next Accreditation System. The target for all programs is the maximum cycle length of five years at this time but will ultimately migrate to ideally 10 years. However, the number is sort of “garbage in, garbage out” because we have programs that have tenure cycles: Pediatrics, and Neonatology are slated to not be surveyed until the year 2022. Some programs in the country were given dates in 2024. However, we will be discussing more of what the ACGME is working on.

ACTION: The GMEC supports the accreditation cycle lengths for all GME programs.
Open Issue

E. Work hours update – Dr. Moore said that being that we have some wayward individuals who are not keeping up. Diana Duva now solely responsible effectively for tracking the hours for the cost report for CMS. Diana Duva stressed that it is of the utmost importance to continue trying hard and stress that they do them in a timely manner. No way can they remember a month or so exactly what hours they worked. To encourage and remind residents to complete their duty hours. GME money for salaries, Medicare Important to get money from Medicare—the major source of hospital income. Must document by site for the hours they work and every time they change locations and of course the date. Dr. Moore stated that we are attempting to streamline this better so to have a template set up. To preload what a routine schedule would be for a Pediatric or Department of Medicine resident. Lists what he or she would typically do, and them be able to modify each month. This has been requested of One 45. The newspapers have stated that the government is stepping up its enforcement of medicare fraud. They would consider it fraud if there were entries into the residents work schedule, which would not have been verified. Audits usually do not occur until 2-3 years after the paperwork submission. Dr. Moore stated that we need them to be accurate.

ACTION: The GMEC strongly encourages the programs to remind the residents and fellows to keep accurate account of their duty hours. **OPEN ISSUE**

F. Temporary Postgraduate Training Permits/GA /South Carolina and Unrestricted Licenses – Dr. Moore said that residents need to be in a position in which we can demonstrate that they have at least one or the other, especially since they seldom have both. Ms. Holly Walp sends out reminders to the residents when the expirations are nearing. Anyone without a verified unrestricted license or temporary residency permit, should be withdrawn from clinical care because that violates the medical practice act for the state.

ACTION: The GMEC supports the encouragement and diligent reminders to the housestaff to maintain their training permits/unrestricted licenses

G. Joint Commission Update- Dr. Moore said the VA was successful in its survey. The VA was able to demonstrate in a number of areas pertinent. Eighty-one and a half residents, which totals to be about 5.4 million dollars are paid for by the VA, so had the VA failed the Joint Commission that would have been catastrophic.

ACTION: The GMEC recommends everyone remain alert to the next visit of the Joint Commission. **OPEN ISSUE**

H. Institutional Affiliation Agreements and Program Letters of Agreement- Dr. Moore said that every program needs to keep up with their agreements, making sure that none are more than 5 years old or are past the stated ending date on the document. Changes also need to be made if something changes such as program directors or site directors.

ACTION: The GMEC encourages all programs to review their agreements with outside institutions. **OPEN ISSUE**

I. CMO Report – Dr. Kanto

- Throughout/Length of Stay – Dr. Kanto said that the diagnosis is calculated in to determine the length of stay. Going to that date is best for the patient. However, going past that date is the responsibility of the physician. If you can get the patient out of the hospital earlier that is to your advantage -- the amount of money is the same. If they stay later, that is the problem of the physician.
- ERR/Synchronicity Update – There will be a code update due in the middle of March, 2013 which will make documentation much easier. Hopefully, we will be able to get back to improving some of the things we need to do.
- Anticipated Discharges -- Discharge orders being written earlier now which has been a tremendous help, has improved input and has improved waiting time. Please spread the work how much better it has made things. More contemplated discharge orders being written. We still have room for improvement but it is

obvious folks are trying harder.

- Hospice/palliative care services – Dr. Kanto said there has been good response and has allowed us to care for patients in a different way and a better way than before. Sharon Bell is on a mission trip to Ecuador. David Haburchak is filling in for Ms. Bell. Dr. Kanto asked that you not call Dr. Haburchak but instead contact Rosemary in Case Management. If she needs any assistance Dr. Haburchak can help. Dr. Kanto asked that we share with the housestaff that he is very sorry that they have to write new orders but when they are admitting patients that is a totally separate service from the hospital which is why they have to readmit the patients. Dr. Kanto said to please express to the housestaff his apologies.
- Responses to Clinical Inquiries – Dr. Kanto said they are getting a good response. Running 95 percent most of the time but need to increase the MCC's (the major complications in comorbidities). Still not doing as good a job as we would like to do in regards to the complications of the comorbidities. The length of stay is based on their merit and the major complications linked to comorbidity are a way to increase our reimbursement from CMS.
- Medical Newsletter: Dr. Kanto sends out a medical newsletter questionnaire to the patients after hospitalization to get patient satisfaction feedback, which focuses on physician communication. Some of the questions are as follows: Did you understand your doctor? Did your doctor talk to you? Did your doctor give you an opportunity to ask questions? Did your doctor let you talk?

In support of this, Dr. Kanto encourages patient satisfaction and uses the AIDET acronym to help residents and students learn:

- A – Acknowledge the patient by name, that they are important, etc. This sets a tone for the entire visit.
- I – Introduce yourself and your role: I am the attending, I am the Resident, I am the medical student, etc.
- D – Duration: Be sure to communicate with the patient the anticipated length of time. Keep in touch.
- E – Explanation: Explain to them what you will be doing so they will understand what to expect.
- T – Thank them for using our hospital

J. GHSU/Community Hospital Affiliations: Affiliations with University, Doctors and Trinity — Dr., Moore said a rotation besides the two principle hospitals anytime resident is leaving you should be certain to have an MOU's, PLA's and that we stay in control of the training the residents are going to be getting. Our responsibility is to maintain control even though they will be trained by service line directors and others.

ACTION: The GMEC supports these three programs in their training efforts and encourages the creation of new opportunities for residents at community hospitals. **OPEN ISSUE**

- K. ACGME Resident/Fellow Survey** – Dr. Moore said that twelve more of our programs are up for the survey process and those in the room today already know who they are. There are five weeks for residents to complete. We need 70% of residents to complete. For us to maintain our accreditation at an institutional level, they are pushing very hard and demanding this 70% be met. Dr. Moore also said that we have received notification of the Faculty Survey which is actually during most times more problematic to get the faculty to fill out than the residents. We need at least 60% faculty participation. Once the deadline has been exceeded, we are apparently unable to access the survey.

A committee member asked Dr. Moore if there is a way to go in and track to see the percentage of completion. Dr. Moore said he can usually go in and retrieve results, but an attending committee member stated that once its program deadline had passed, they were unable to access it any longer.

ACTION: The GMEC urges all interns, residents and fellows to complete the ACGME survey once it resumes next winter. **OPEN ISSUE**

- L. CMS tracking/One45 Software** – Ms. Duva Previously discussed . Please refer to E (above).

M. NRMP:

- **NRMP Statement on Professionalism** – Dr. Moore included again in handout. 3rd and 4th year medical students. When they have gone into the programs across the Southeast and country, they have run into programs and found out that they were pushed them into telling them how they were going to rank them. This is a flagrant violation of the NRMP. These students have no axe to grind but they are asking us how to answer. A violation of the NRMP policy at an institutional level
A resident or student level: one or two year lockout not being able to go through the Match. Program level the Program can be sanctioned.
- **NRMP "All-in" Policy** - Dr. Moore – We are not in any violation of any of the core programs. They know exactly how many slots we have in the ACGME AND THE NRMP and they expect those to meet. Our emergency medicine program is having military matches and they've already matched people. The NRMP didn't believe us so they went to the Surgeon General's office and expected to see in writing: who are these people? Does all of this make sense to the NRMP from the military match perspective, what was the process? Oh, and by the way, you are going to have to do this every year that you participate in the military match. They were willing to go to the United States Supreme Court to maintain their monopoly

of military matching.

- **NRMP Main Match Schedule/Match Day:**– Dr. Moore said this is scheduled for March 15, 2013, The Ides of March
- Off cycle residents: Exceptions for them. Important to not appear we are trying to avoid the match. Dr. Moore expressed that this is not one of those situations where it is better to beg for forgiveness than to ask for permission. If we do not have a slot filled, it is simply not worth risking. If we do not have permission, we are not going to do it. There are too many threats in which we take extremely seriously.

ACTION: The GMEC strongly encourages everyone to follow the NRMP Statement on Professionalism, to remain in compliance with the All-In Policy and the NRMP main match schedule. **OPEN ISSUE**

N. Housestaff Organization 2012-2013 Dr. Moore mentioned that the Housestaff Organization has been revitalized. President is Dr. Amin Yehya, a Cardiology Fellow. We have officers and action committees. Dr. Yehya informed the GMEC Committee about the successful toy drive that the Housestaff held. Dr. Yehya met with the residents regarding different issues they have raised such as: the food, the lounge, duty hours and hospital discharges. Dr. Yehya shared with the committee also that the communication was going well and thanked the GME. Dr. Moore responded: “Yes, we have had great communication but we must **hear** it; **that** is the key.”

ACTION: The GMEC encourages the entire housestaff to support the Housestaff Organization and to continue great communication amongst the two entities. **OPEN ISSUE**

O. Annual National ACGME Meeting in Orlando FL March 1-3, 2013-
Dr. Moore is asking for about \$40,000 for Program Directors to be able to attend the Annual National ACGME Meeting in Orlando, Florida every three years. Program coordinators are also to be included in educational support activities with a commitment of \$20,000 per year.

ACTION: The GMEC offers it support to the Program Directors being able to attend the Annual National ACGME Meeting in Orlando, Florida every three years. **OPEN ISSUE**

(AHME) Association Hospital Medical Education: Eighteen coordinators signed up for and went to Emory to train as residency coordinators. A new program requirement by the ACGME is that the Program Directors and the administrative support people, as well as the Institution demonstrate that individuals are being given the proper instruction/information “From the Mountain”, Dr. Moore said.

ACTION: The GMEC urges all coordinators to attempt to take part in the annual AHME which is held each year in Atlanta, Georgia.

P. S.T.A.R. Students Training in Augusta Residencies update- Dr. Moore Chairs this committee and shared with the committee of a report from the S.T.A.R. which stands for Students Training in Augusta Residencies, that was given to the Dean. Out of that report, we will see some actions and activities that will be coming out of that to try to focus some of our energies and efforts, all at a program level, institutional level, as well as college level of our students. We had an 11% retention rate of our students which is very low compared to the 22 other institutions Dr. Moore was able to identify from websites. Dr. Moore said that we are going to have the Match. We have 108 physicians listed in the handout that will be matching with us primarily on level one, but also some PGY level 2's, on March 15. This is closely tracked by school, legislative groups, and by the Georgia Board of Physician Workforce.

ACTION: The GMEC strongly supports actions and activities to help raise the retention rate of our students.

Q. Housestaff Salaries effective January 1, 2013—Dr. Moore said that housestaff got an increase. Thanks to Dr. Kanto and the hospital leadership in the school.

ACTION: The GMEC supports the raise increases which were offered for the Housestaff. CLOSED ISSUE

R. GMEC Membership – Addition of Ms. Linda Henderson, Chief of Quality Management, as a voting member of the GMEC (new IRC requirement) with Ms. Bonita Norman as the alternate quality and safety representative —Dr. Moore welcomed and thanked both Ms. Linda Henderson and Ms. Bonita Norman here today for their first GMEC meeting. A requirement now that Quality & Patient Safety experts are a part of the GMEC Committee.

ACTION: The GMEC supports the participation of the Chief of Quality Management and her alternate. CLOSED ISSUE

S. ACGME Site Visit: Internal Medicine RRC Site Visit February 21, 2013 –

Dr. Moore stated that the Internal Medicine RRC will be coming this Thursday. They will have a Ph.D. educator here to focus on areas that were identified by the residents on the 3-year running cycle resident survey, which is a result of the Compliance Committee that is now tracking resident survey, faculty survey, board pass rates and resident evaluations. The Urology evaluations for the residents are going directly to the Milestone “test highway”,(directly to the ACGME to the RRC for Urology). The Compliance Committee checked our data relative to our resident survey, sent a letter and said they were going to come before April 30, 2013 and they are coming February 21, which has short tracked our cycle by nine months. Being that they have

deviated from that does raise question to us that they might be a bit concerned and feel the need to come sooner.

ACTION: The GMEC supports the Internal Medicine RRC Site Visit Thursday, February 21, 2013.

T. AHME Academy in Atlanta February 1, 2013

Ms. Holly Walp, Manager, of the Graduate Medical Education shared with the committee that the AHME, which stands for Association for Hospital Medical Education, in February of 2013, turned out very well. In fact, it was so well publicized, that they had to turn away about 40 people due to lack of seating. During this event, the AHME actually discussed starting a bi-annual event. Shawnda Claxton, a Coordinator from Rheumatology also shared her own experience from this event by stating that it was “Practical and useful.” Ms. Claxton also said, “You could gain feedback from other coordinators in ways in which they run their own programs.”

ACTION: The GMEC encourages the GME Fellowship Coordinators to attend the annual AHME Academy when possible.

U. Resident of the Year Nominations (8 nominees) - Dr. Moore expressed his very sincere opinion that it will be very difficult “selecting” a resident of the year.

ACTION: The GMEC offers its support of selecting a resident of the year.

V. VA Billing Update - Dr. Moore said that we are getting a lot of attention from the DEAN. So to leave money on the table with the VA goes back to the state. The Dean cannot use locally. We are successful recouping about 95% of dollars but the 5 % left on the table is about ¼ million dollars – a significant amount. Holly Walp told Dr. Moore during the meeting that Kelly Callaway has said, based on July August and September of 2012, those in a deficit must pay back the Dean no later than the end of February of 2012.

Dr. Moore read the questions and examples on how we are supposed to count on call time and he rationed that this is “doable”, but we must do carefully. The VA is paying for residents but if they can identify that residents they are being paid for and that also the CMS is paying that certainly would constitute fraud. We are reporting over 350 FTE of resident activity but only being paid for 324 for IME about 319 for DME. We should be okay but we are getting advice from Legal Affairs just to be sure. We should be in a position to recoup all of the dollars.

- **Site Directors/Program Director Responsibilities–** Dr. Moore explained that on pages 32 and 33 of this handout shown are examples how a resident covering three different hospitals when they’re covering only 1/3 of that nite float can be assigned

to the VA.

ACTION: The GMEC encourages all programs to be extremely careful when using residents at the VA and to be certain all of the dollars provided by the state are being recouped. **OPEN ISSUE**

W. Flu Season – Dr. Moore asked Dr. Bill Kanto if the flu season restraints could be relaxed some. Dr. Kanto replied that he is waiting for the IC Committee to provide recommendation.

ACTION: The GMEC supports the decision to wait on the word from Dr. Kanto and the Infection Control Committee before relaxing the restrictions placed during Flu Season of FY 13. **OPEN ISSUE**

X. H1- B Visa Issues-Dr. Moore said that the word coming directly from LD Newman's office is to continue trying to discourage HI-B Visa's as they are much more difficult than a J. Peter Rissing, MD, FACP, FIDSA Section Chief, Infectious Diseases Sydenstricker Endowed Chair Distinguished Professor of Medicine Principle Investigator, Ryan White Programs at GHSU-1 Visa holder. They are more expensive, there are difficult issues with renewals being that they have to be renewed with the state department.

AREAS NOT IN SUBSTANTIAL COMPLIANCE (CITATIONS)

The Review Committee cited the following areas as not in substantial compliance with the ACGME's Requirements for Graduate Medical Education:

Citation #1:

Faculty Scholarship/Active Research [CPR II.B.5.]

The faculty must establish and maintain an environment of inquiry and scholarship with an active research component.

(Previous Citation) The information provided did not demonstrate compliance with the requirement. Specifically, the Committee noted that the program has hired additional faculty and a research coordinator, however, the effectiveness of these changes is not yet apparent. Of the 15 core faculty listed in the physician faculty roster, eight list no peer-reviewed publications and 6 list no review articles, chapters, or textbooks for the most recent five year period (2007-2012). Through its peer review, therefore, the Committee determined that this level of faculty scholarly activity is not sufficient to support an environment of inquiry and scholarship.

Citation #2:

Available and Adequate Program Resources [CPR II.D.]

The institution and the program must jointly ensure the availability of adequate resources for resident education, as defined in the specialty program requirements.

The information provided did not demonstrate compliance with the requirement. Specifically, it was noted at the time of the site visit that conference room space was inadequate.

OTHER COMMENTS

The Committee noted that only one resident appears to have been actively involved in QI processes, while the infrastructure exists in the form of the Orthopaedic Quality Council. The program should encourage active participation by more residents.

Review of the minimums table in the 2011-2012 case log program report for graduating residents showed two defined categories where at least one resident's total case numbers were below the required minimum number: ACL Reconstruction (1 resident) and Ankle/Hind/Mid Foot Arthro (3 residents). The program is advised that, beginning with the 2012-2013 academic year, such deficiencies will be noted as non-compliant.

The Committee will review the 2012-2013 case log report in one year.

The residency director and family medicine faculty should develop a list of procedural competencies required for completion by all residents in the program prior to their graduation.

The committee will use scores for a minimum of three and a maximum of five years and will take into consideration noticeable improvements or declines during the period considered. Poor performance will be cited if more than 10% of a program's candidates fail on the first examination over a period of consecutive years and/or the program's composite score is consistently at or below the 25th percentile in the nation.

The information provided to the Committee by the American Board of Family Medicine indicates that only 75% of first time test takers passed the exam over the most recent five year timeframe (ABFM data)

At the time of the next review, the program's accreditation status will be in jeopardy if these areas have not been addressed satisfactorily and/or other major areas warranting citation develop.

AREAS NOT IN SUBSTANTIAL COMPLIANCE (CITATIONS)

The Review Committee cited the following areas as not in substantial compliance with the ACGME's Requirements for Graduate Medical Education:

Citation #1:

Faculty - Adequate Number

Common Program Requirement: II.B.1.

At each participating site, there must be a sufficient number of faculty with documented qualifications to instruct and supervise all fellows at that location.

The program does not ensure that there is a sufficient number of faculty to provide supervision and research mentorship for the fellows. At the time of the site visit, it was noted that there was an insufficient number of faculty to supervise the fellows on the motility rotation. The site visitor also noted that while there are multiple research opportunities available, finding a research mentor can be "problematic" for the fellows. The lack of faculty supervision and instruction were substantiated by the results of the most recent resident survey. The 2012 results showed only 43% compliance in the areas of sufficient supervision and sufficient instruction.

Citation #2:

Faculty - Sufficient Time (Previous Citation)

Common Program Requirement: II.B.1.a)

The faculty must devote sufficient time to the educational program to fulfill their supervisory and teaching responsibilities; and to demonstrate a strong interest in the education of fellows.

At the time of the site visit, it was noted that faculty time dedicated to the educational program had improved since the last review; however, the site visitor noted that there was consensus that this is still an area in need of improvement, specifically related to faculty lectures.

Citation #3:

Faculty – Fellow Scholarly Activities

Common Program Requirement: II.B.5.c)

Faculty should encourage and support fellows in scholarly activities.

It is unclear whether the faculty encourage and support the fellows in scholarly activities. The site visitor noted that fellows experience difficulty finding a research mentor and that this difficulty appears to be directly related to the issue in citation #1 regarding an insufficient number of faculty.
