

1.0 Purpose


To establish a format for the provision education on core non-clinical topics to House Officers

2.0 Procedure

- 2.1 The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education mandates that all House officers graduate with competency in a wide variety of topics that are not strictly clinical and which are broadly applicable to all medical specialties. Such topics in medical ethics, socioeconomic influences on health, medical/legal and cost-containment issues that affect GME and medical practice as well as appropriate introduction to communication skills and to research design, statistics and critical review of the literature necessary for acquiring skills for lifelong learning
- 2.2 The IRCC (Noon Conference) is designed to meet ACGME requirements. Documentation of attendance of each House Officer must be part of their Residency Training file.
- 2.3 If a House Officer has not participated in a conference, they are required to attend weekly conferences. Each Residency Program will ensure that their House Officers become familiar with the topics listed in the current years Interdisciplinary Residency Core Curriculum (IRCC) in one of the following formats:
- 2.3.1 The Program Director will require every House Officer to view the presentations on-line if they are unable to attend the Conference. Each House Office will also be required to take an on-line test. House Officers will have the ability to print a copy of his/her participation of web viewing and must be included in their Residency Training file. If a House Officer is unable to attend conference, they must view the conference and take an on-line test/survey.
- 2.3.2 The Program will devise its own curriculum, based upon the list of topics presented in the ACGME Institutional Requirements, and will require that each House Office attend all of the lectures and/or conferences provided by the Program.
- 2.4 Each Program must take attendance or obtain signature of the House Offices for each part of the Series, and, upon request, provide a copy of the attendance list or signatures to the Senior Associate Dean for Graduate Medical Education and VA Affairs.
