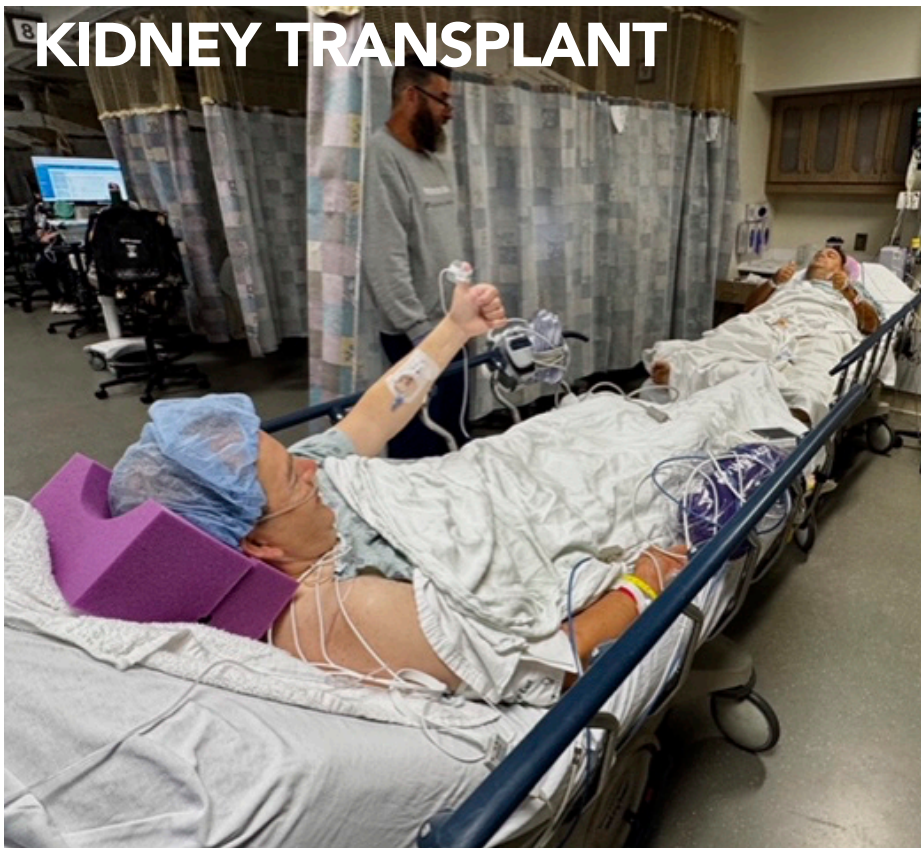

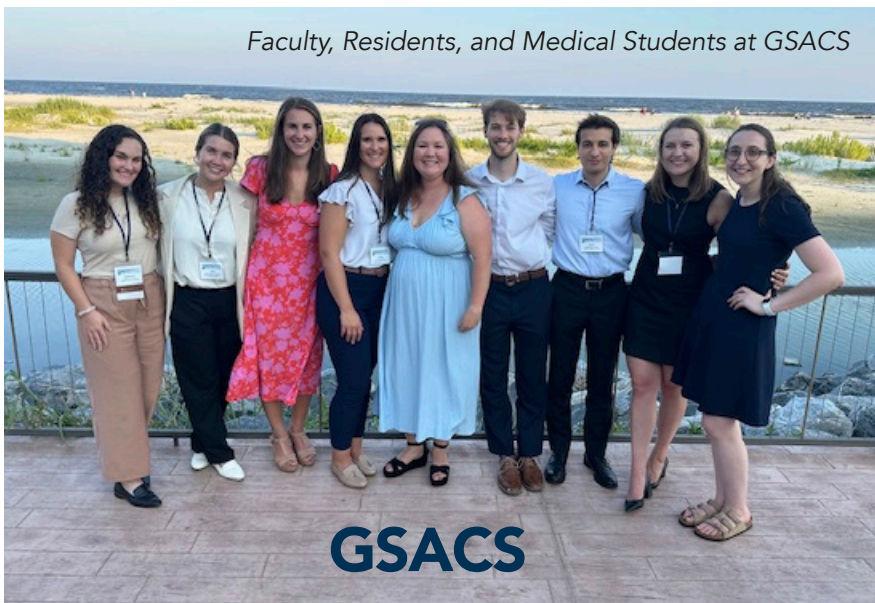
KIDNEY TRANSPLANT
