

Receive ABFM Performance Improvement Credit (MOC IV) for Teaching

Medical College of Georgia/Augusta University has been approved as a Sponsor of American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) Performance Improvement Credit (MOC IV). This credit is available to those who precept (Medical College of Georgia/Augusta University's) medical students, residents, or fellows and who participate in a teaching improvement activity.

To receive the ABFM credit, family physicians need to:

- Complete at least 180 1:1 contact hours with a resident, fellow, or student
- Participate in an intervention to improve teaching skills
- Review and reflect on the results of the intervention
- Complete an attestation

Once preceptors complete the requirements, Medical College of Georgia/Augusta University submits the completion information to ABFM. Developing Faculty Teaching Skills on the Use of Point of Care Ultrasound to Enhance Medical Student Education among a Statewide Network of Community Teaching Faculty

Project Aim: This project aims to improve our community based clinical faculties selfassessment of their knowledge of incompetency with basic point-of-care ultrasound techniques, provide him with methods to use point-of-care ultrasound as a pool to teach medical students, and give them site-specific medical student feedback on the effectiveness of their implemented teaching methods after at least 3 months of medical student contact an ultrasound practice at the clinical site.

<u>Teaching Intervention</u>: Faculty will be provided the opportunity to get point-of-care ultrasound training in several possible ways:

1. Point-of-care ultrasound workshop training during the annual faculty development meeting

OR

- 2. Look over and review the following videos developed by the Medical College of Georgia Center for Ultrasound Education (CUSE YouTube Channel) with attestation of completion (we will send you this attestation form if needed by email).
 - a. Ultrasound in Medical Education LSL 2018
 - b. Evaluation for Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm
 - c. Aorta Vasculature Anatomy 2018

Reference and resources can be found on the Centers for Ultrasound Education website for all faculty to continue to use throughout the year as needed. See reference resource page in this packet for details.

Data Collection: Faculty will be required to complete a brief online survey before participating in the point-of-care ultrasound educational session, after completing the point of care ultrasound educational session, and then again 3 months (or later) after having the opportunity to put the educational intervention and to practice in the clinical setting. Please make sure to provide your American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) ID number and initials if you are taking the survey for Part IV Credit. This will only be used to track the completion of the required elements by the ABFM to award MOC Part IV Credit. We will not use this information to link to particular survey answers as this is simply self-reflection to help you personally improve your teaching skills. Example of survey included in packet.

<u>Teaching Hours</u>: Your 1 on 1 medical student teaching contact hours will be tracked by our medical student education office based on the students that are rotating at your site during their family medicine clerkship. This should be easily met with one student rotating with you during one 6 week clerkship rotation (40 hour work week x 6 weeks = 240 teaching contact hours)

Attestation: You will them be provided with an attestation required by the ABFM once all requirements completed which will be submitted and used to award your part IV performance improvement credit (this will be sent to you once completed all elements).
