RESIDENT'S LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Planning to take your loved one home for the Holidays? Here are some helpful reminders regarding Georgia War's therapeutic leave policy:

- Temporary planned overnight absences may be granted after approval by the medical staff.
- Overnight therapeutic leave may in no case exceed twelve (12) days of overnight leave per calendar year.
- Therapeutic leave may be canceled if the resident's medical condition contraindicates leaving the facility.
- All requests for therapeutic leave must be made at least seven (7) days in advance.
- For leave requested less than seven (7) days before departure, prescriptions will be written for necessary medications and the family/responsible party will be required to have prescription(s) filled at their expense.
- Also remember to complete the sign in and sign out log sheet in the leave book at the time of departure and return.
- Please notify nursing home staff immediately if Resident's condition changes while on leave.

INFECTION PREVENTION UPDATE

Georgia War Veterans Nursing Home currently has 3 positive COVID-19 cases. Incidence of a COVID-19 variant has increased threefold in the U.S. in recent weeks. According to federal tracking, hospitalizations and deaths are on a steady upward incline. As an immediate action we are strongly recommending that all our residents receive the newest COVID-19 vaccination. We understand that some of our resident's had some level of COVID vaccine in the past; however, similar to the influenza virus, the COVID-19 virus can change over time making previous vaccines ineffective in preventing illness and death from COVID-19. Vaccines that target those viruses may be updated to better protect against disease. An updated COVID-19 vaccine will help give your loved one the best protection available against COVID-19.

We are currently testing all residents and staff and have implemented our respiratory illness plan in efforts to prevent further spread of the virus. Our goal is to start administering the vaccine to as many residents as possible, sometime in the week of December 4th-11th. The vaccine that we will administer is the Moderna Spikevax vaccine. The GWVNH Administrative team (Carlton Deese, Executive Director, Julia Eveker Associate Director, and Stephanie Nichols, ADON), Medical Director (Dr. Richard Sams), and Infection Prevention nurse (April Holliman, RN) have met to discuss the prevention measures at the facility, and we strongly encourage you to consider providing consent for your resident to receive the vaccination. We are providing this information to allow you an opportunity to make an informed decision to vaccinate your loved one. Thank you and if you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to us.

Visitation Guidelines:

- 1. Mask mandate for all staff and visitors.
- 2. Only small groups of 5 visitors/volunteers or less permitted in the building at a time.
- 3. No more than 3 family members at a time are permitted to visit a resident. (This does not apply to end-of-life situations.)
- 4. Visitors under the age of 18 are not permitted in the building. (This does not apply to end-of-life situations.)
 - 5. Practice social distancing when appropriate.
 - 6. Please wash/sanitize hands frequently.
 - 7. If you are sick, please stay at home.




Warrior of the Month
