Dear Thesis Writer,

The Honors Program wishes to create a digital copy of your completed Honors thesis and save it in Scholarly Commons (<http://augusta.openrepository.com/augusta/>). Preserving it this way will allow only Augusta University students, staff, and faculty to access and download your work. You will of course remain the owner of your intellectual property—no one else may alter your work, and any use of your work must be properly cited.

For Scholarly Commons to reproduce, translate and distribute your submission worldwide, your agreement to the following terms is necessary. Please take some time to read the terms of this license, indicate below if you choose to grant license, and return it to the HP office.

This is a non-exclusive license. By granting this license, you (the author and copyright owner) grants to the Augusta University's Campus Repository the non-exclusive right to reproduce, translate (as defined below), and/or distribute your submission (including the abstract, if applicable) to the Augusta University community in print and electronic format and in any medium, including but not limited to audio or video. You agree that the Augusta University's Campus Repository may, without changing the content, translate the submission to any medium or format for the purpose of preservation. You also agree that the Augusta University's Campus Repository may keep more than one copy of this submission for purposes of security, back-up and preservation. You represent that the submission is your original work, and that you have the right to grant the rights contained in this license. You also represent that your submission does not, to the best of your knowledge, infringe upon anyone's copyright. Should you choose to grant a license for your thesis, you may select to impose an embargo, that is, a period for which the full text of your thesis will not be available for the Augusta University community to download or view. The embargo options are 2 years, 5 years, or 10 years. If you wish to select an embargo period, please do so in your response. Finally, whether or not you choose to grant license, you may register a copyright on your work through the U. S. Copyright office; the cost is \$55, and information is available at <http://copyright.gov/help/faq/index.html>.
