- Acquisition of basic life support knowledge and skills, including the diagnosis and treatment of shock
- Recognize the presence of a patient with a serious condition that necessitates urgent or emergent attention and prioritize attention

- o Open the airway
- o Ventilatory support with bag-mask-valve apparatus
- o Circulation augmentation
- o Hemorrhage control using external pressure and hemostatic products.
- Acquisition of knowledge to:
 - o Recognize potentially treatable neurological insults
 - o Recognize, and initially manage, potentially dangerous and treatable poisonings
 - o Treat superficial burns and recognize when higher level of care is required
 - o Assess injured extremities for possible fracture or dislocation and identify those requiring x-rays and/or referral

- In the setting of emergent and urgent patient presentations, students will be expected to:
 - o Treat all patients using a patient and family centered care approach
 - o Rapidly triage patients by severity of illness and rapidly deliver care
 - o Rapidly obtain a complete, focused medical history and physical exam
 - o Rapidly perform life saving procedures (see Emergency Procedures Course)
 - o Construct a complete differential diagnosis ordered by illness severity
 - o Interpret clinical, lab, roentgenologic testing to deductively narrow differential diagnosis
 - o Initiate appropriate therapeutic strategies in order of severity of illness
 - o Every patient that you encounter in the ED should be treated the way that you would want a member of your family treated. You should treat all staff members (physicians, nurses, administrative staff, etc.) with respect, and likewise, you should expect the same in return.
