We are excited to welcome to the department two new faculty members. Patrick F. Morgan, MD joined the department as Assistant Professor of Otolaryngology on August 16, 2021; and Heather A. Koehn, MD, MMHC joined the department as Assistant Professor of Pediatric Otolaryngology on September 1, 2021.

Dr. Koehn earned her undergraduate degree at Creighton University in Omaha, NE and her medical degree at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill. She completed her residency in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Virginia, followed by a fellowship in Pediatric Otolaryngology at Vanderbilt University. She also completed a master's degree in healthcare management (MMHC) from Vanderbilt's Owen Graduate School of Management.

Dr. Koehn is trained in all aspects of Pediatric Otolaryngology and specializes in cleft lip and palate-craniofacial reconstruction, lymphovascular malformations, and pediatric voice, swallowing, speech, hearing, sinus, head and neck, and thyroid disorders. Her research interests are pediatric voice and swallowing disorders.

Dr. Koehn will also serve as the Otolaryngology Medical Student Clerkship Director.

His research interests include, but are not limited to, microvascular reconstruction, quality of life and outcome metrics in the head and neck cancer population, advanced cutaneous malignancies, furthering our understanding of the psychosocial stress of head and neck cancer, microvascular reconstruction, and oral tongue malignancies.
