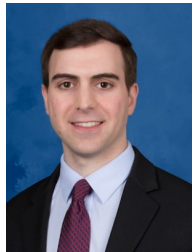
Welcome New Residents and Fellows

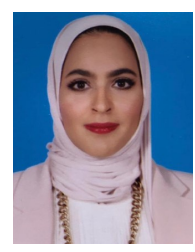

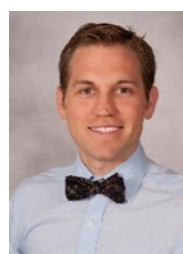
Luke Edelmayer
