

ACGME Common Program Requirements for Faculty Development

Per ACGME Common Program Requirements for Residencies, *II.B.2. Faculty members must pursue faculty development designed to enhance their skills at least annually (1) as educators, (2) in quality improvement and patient safety, (3) in fostering their own and their residents' well-being, and (4) in patient care based on their practice-based learning and improvement efforts.*

Per ACGME Common Program Requirements for Fellowships, *II.B.2. Faculty members must pursue faculty development designed to enhance their skills at least annually.*

Per ACGME Common Program Requirements for One-Year Fellowships, *II.B.2. Faculty members must pursue faculty development designed to enhance their skills.*
